1



Reach out for more resources

Find a club sponsor

Ask a teacher or responsible adult to sponsor your chapter. In school, a teacher will help you register your club with the school. For community groups, a responsible adult will help you stay organized and on track. Templates provided.

Get the word out

Post flyers around your school or community, make social media posts, and talk with your friends, classmates, and peers about joining the club. Create an email list or group chat to coordinate meetings and volunteer events.

Host your first meeting

Host your first meeting! Use our meeting presentation template to guide your first meeting. Providing pizza or other snacks is a great way to recruit more attendees!
